# **Average Daily Visitors**

**Pedestrian Count** 

In August 2019, the average daily pedestrian count was **404,181**, a **3.8**% decrease from August 2018.

While pedestrian counts declined slightly year over year, August 2019 counts are up from last month.

Pedestrian counts reached their peak on August 16 at 434,735 people.






## **Commercial Real Estate**

#### Class A

In August, Times Square's Class A commercial office occupancy rate remained at 93% year over year and consistent with July. This is slightly **higher** than Midtown's rate of **91%**.

In Times Square, the average price per square foot, \$66, decreased slightly from July while the average price per square foot remained at \$74 in Midtown.

In August there were six Class A leases totalling 191,287 SF.




### **Hotels**

#### Rates & Occupancy

In July, average daily room rates in Times Square hotels fell by **5.7%** from 2018 to **\$230**. Occupancy rates were consistent with 2018 at 94%, remaining higher than Midtown and Manhattan occupancy rates of 90%.

Average daily rates for the Midtown and Manhattan submarkets declined by 3.3% and 3.1% respectively. Occupancy rates remained relatively unchanged. with a decline of 0.8% in Midtown and 0.4% in Manhattan.




In August 2019, Broadway ticket sales decreased by **11%** and attendance decreased by **6%** compared to August 2018.

Overall, **30** shows played this month. With six shows closing in August, several saw increases in sales during their final weeks, including *Pretty Woman*, *King Kong*, and *The Cher Show*.



Previews for *Betrayal* began on August 14 at the Bernard B. Jacobs Theater, and the show officially opened on September 5.
